Overview

The goal of the final project is to put to work the techniques you have learned in this course in order to complete your proposed project. Although we had fixed requirements for the mid-term project the final project is more open in nature and you may use any combination of elements and styles you feel necessary to achieve your finished product.

You may make changes to your project from your initial proposal but be sure to document your reasons for these changes.

Your project will be evaluated based on the following criteria

- Links resolve internally
- Images load correctly (make sure your images are not relative to your computer)
- CSS files linked appropriately
- Properly titled pages
- HTML element structure is organized
- CSS is not redundant (Do not have meaningless CSS or multiple declarations for the same selector where it is unnecessary to do so)
- Semantic use of HTML (This is somewhat subjective so try your best)
- Pages load correctly across multiple browsers (I will use Safari and Firefox as this is what we use in class)

It may be best to load your project on multiple computers to ensure that you have CSS and images linked properly.

What to turn in

You will need to turn in your project's html folder in a compressed archive emailed to me by the due date. Please document any changes to your project from your proposal in a separate document.
